I have a friend from seminary who once told me her feelings on the phrase "the youth are the church of the future." She said to me, "the youth aren't the church of the future, they are *the church*—today, now."

There is much wisdom and truth in this, and it goes beyond just "the youth." The Holy Trinity of *today* is made up of people of all ages and walks of life, from ages 0-100! This is why we've had exciting opportunities at our recent Ministry Fair to find ways to be the Holy Trinity of today.

One area that is closest to my heart is ministry with my peers in the 20-30 age group. As of now, we are beginning development on ways in which this group, too, can be the "church of today." Of course, we worship together. But there are opportunities on the horizon to study together and fellowship together.

One such offering is the "That's in The Bible?!" series beginning this month. HIGHER EDUCATION

Today most of us acquire a high school education. Some then go on to study in college. A lesser number continue their studies and receive a master's degree, and a few move beyond that to obtain a doctorate. These latter have the right to place before their names the title "Doctor" as a sign of their achievement and their degree of knowledge.

My father did not go beyond grade school, but the scope of his knowledge and wisdom exceeded that of many persons I know who have advanced degrees. My father was self– taught; it was the kind of ongoing process that should be embraced by everyone. While I studied formally for five years after high school in my preparation as an Architect and four years for the diaconate, I have neither a master's nor a doctor's degree from the schools, but I am well on my way to a doctor's degree from U.M. of which I am very proud. U.M. doesn't stand for the University of Missouri, Mississippi, Massachusetts, Montana, Minnesota or Michigan, but rather for the University of Mistakes.

All over the country at this time of year people are again preparing to continue their studies at various levels of education. As we or our children, grandchildren or friends go off to school, it's also time for you and me to go back to the classrooms of "good ole" U.of M. In fact, there's no way we can play hooky from that school. But we can sleep through class! We are truant when we try to hide our mistakes or pretend that we don't make them. I find the mistakes in my life have a habit of repeating themselves. The first time I make a mistake, I learn a valuable lesson. If I make the same mistake, the lesson is more deeply impressed in my mind. There is nothing to be ashamed about for making such errors in daily life. They are part of attending the most famous university in the world, the Self-Taught School of Higher Education. The third time ,however, is "test time." If I repeat the mistake after two lessons, then I flunk.

Even though the greatest minds, the most creative geniuses, are all alumni or alumnae of U.of M., why is it that most of us try to cover up the fact that we are students there? Perhaps it is because when we were beginners in school we were the object of laughter when we made a mistake. The shame that accompanies such experiences is the shadow of our mistakes, often causing us to avoid new activities that are pregnant with the possibility of making another mistake.

Jesus was well aware that life and mistakes go hand in hand. When we make an error that is the failure to love ourselves, our neighbors or God correctly, that mistake is called a sin. In the famous prayer that Jesus gave us, he included an important lesson for all who attend the U.of M. "Forgive us our mistakes as we forgive those who make mistakes that cause us pain or shame. "Those who are unable to embrace their own errors in life, who hide their mistakes and are unable to forgive themselves, will find it almost impossible to forgive others freely.

As yellow school buses once again travel the city streets, let us proudly return to our studies at the U.of M. To be middle-aged and still in school is nothing to be ashamed of. I hope that when death's angel comes for me, it will find me still in class at U.M.
