



The Lessons

While visiting the Temple, Peter and John have seen a man lame from birth. Peter has commanded him, in the name of Jesus, to stand up and walk. Peter now preaches to the crowd who have witnessed the miraculous healing.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (3:12-19)

Peter addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you.

"And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out."

Before we break the bread, first we break open the Scriptures to hear God's word to us.

Psalm 4

Answer me when I call, O God, defender of my cause; * you set me free when I am hard-pressed; have mercy on me and hear my prayer. "You mortals, how long will you dishonor my glory; * how long will you worship dumb idols and run after false gods?" Know that the Lord does wonders for the faithful; * when I call upon the Lord, he will hear me. Tremble, then, and do not sin; * speak to your heart in silence upon your bed. Offer the appointed sacrifices * and put your trust in the Lord. Many are saying, "Oh, that we might see better times!" * Lift up the light of your countenance upon us, O Lord. You have put gladness in my heart, * more than when grain and wine and oil increase. I lie down in peace; at once I fall asleep; * for only you, Lord, make me dwell in safety.

The author has told us that he writes so that his readers may not sin. But should anyone sin, Christ will defend us. We do in fact deviate from God's ways, so we need Jesus' help. But there are also people who are lawless; they make no attempt to follow God's ways.

A Reading from the First Letter of John (3:1-7)

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like This passage is often read at funerals in our tradition.

This Davidic psalm is regularly read in the Office of Compline. him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

The Holy Gospel

PriestThe Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to Luke (24:36b-48).PeopleGlory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus himself stood among the disciples and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence. Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. Jesus refers to the traditional Jewish division of the Old Testament: the Law, the Prophets, and the Writings.

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. But chiefly are we bound to praise you for the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. By his death he has destroyed death, and by his rising to life again he has won for us everlasting life. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

We join in the song of angels and saints in heaven (Isaiah 6:3, Revelation 4:8).



Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. 
Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:



We bless the communion bread and wine by giving thanks to God for the death and resurrection of Jesus and the salvation they give us.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him.

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever.



And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, BCP 364 Jesus teaches us to pray this hallowed be thy Name, prayer in Matthy kingdom come, thy will be done, thew 6:9-13. on earth as it is in heaven. and Luke 11:1-4. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Breaking of the Bread

Celebrant	Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;	1 Corinthians
People	Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.	5:7-8

The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving. The ushers will release the congregation by pew to come forward for Communion. In the Episcopal Church, all baptized Christians, regardless of age or denomination, are welcome to receive Holy Communion. If you are not baptized, or do not wish to take Communion for any other reason, we invite you to come to the rail and cross your arms to receive a blessing from the priest. If you would like to be baptized, please let R-J or D.J. know!

As you come forward for Communion, you have several different options on how to receive (or not receive):

- If you would like to **receive a blessing only**, please cross your arms on your chest and the priest will bless you. Please remain in place as the bread and wine pass by.
- If you would like **gluten-free bread**, please ask the priest at the altar rail.
- If you would like to **receive bread only**, please hold out your hands to receive the bread, eat the bread, then cross your arms when the chalice bearer passes with the wine.
- If you would like to **receive bread and "sip" the wine**, please hold out your hands to receive the bread, eat the bread, and then help the chalice bearer guide the cup to your lips.
- If you would like to **receive bread and "dip" it into the wine**, please hold out your hands to receive the bread, then hold out the bread on your open palm, and the chalice bearer will take the bread from you, dip it in the wine and place the bread directly onto your tongue.
- If you are **unable to come forward**, a priest will come to you at the end of Communion.
